Entries

A performance at this Assessment is compulsory for **ALL** rowers seeking GB Senior / U23 / European / World University (FISU) selection in 2010 **EXCEPT** for rowers who raced at the 2009 World Rowing Championships or European Championships.

Entries must be made through your club OARA Administrator via the British Rowing Online Entry system. The Event Name is: **GB Rowing Snr/U23 Trials**.

Email or phone entries will no longer be accepted except in exceptional circumstances.

Registration & Start Times

Registration will start at 0900. All rowers must register at least 1 hour before their race time, lightweights may register (and officially weigh-in) no earlier than 2 hours before their race time. During registration rowers will be expected to pay the £10 Entry Fee, complete a Rower Information Form and get measured and weighed (in all-in-ones). In an exceptional case a late registration may be accepted but will incur a £20 Entry Fee.

The Ergo tests will start at 11am and a provisional schedule of Tests will be published by Tuesday 20 October following the close of Entries at 17:00 on Thursday 15 October. In an exceptional case a late entry may be accepted but will incur a £20 Entry Fee.

Weigh In for Lightweights

Lightweights will be required to weigh in officially during registration between 2 and 1 hours before their race time. The maximum weight will be 75kg (men) and 61.5kg (women) for all rowers. No one who is outside these weights will be counted as a lightweight in the October results.

Experienced lightweights and those who have trialled before are expected already to be familiar with the GB Rowing Team weight policy and following the guidelines set.

Exceptionally we will allow a rower who is above but close to these weights to progress to the GB Rowing Team December Assessment as a lightweight but they will have to make a written case to support this which will be considered by the Chief Coach and International Manager. Those who were juniors in 2008/9 and/or new to the lightweight pathway and tall are most likely to be successful in their case. Please understand that an exemption will only be allowed if there are clear extenuating circumstances.

There will be no weigh-in on Sunday, except for BUCS eligible lightweight rowers who will need to weigh in on both days at a maximum of 75kg (men) and 61.5kg (women) to be eligible for their BUCS ranking.

Ergo Standards

Rowers who achieve the ergometer standard (below) for their age group will be entered for the race on Sunday.

Rowers who are U20 (born 1.1.90 or after for 2010) will not have to make the U23 ergometer standard and will be entered for Sunday unless their ergometer performance is clearly well below the standard.

BUCS

BUCS rowers also seeking GB Selection will be required to attain the ergometer standard and therefore race in Division 1 (openweight) or Division 2 (lightweight) on Sunday. For all others the ergometer test is optional.

IMPORTANT NOTES

BUCS Small Boats Head

- Details of events offered and how to make entries for the BUCS Small Boats Head can be found on the BUCS Rowing website at www.bucs.org.uk
- BUCS eligible lightweights will need to weigh in again on Sunday 25 October 2 hours before their first race of the day at a maximum of 75kg (men) and 61.5kg (women) to be eligible for their BUCS lightweight small boat ranking.
- Those BUCS eligible rowers when making their entry for the GB Rowing Assessment who normally row for a club need to indicate clearly their university club as well.

General

- There will be a meeting for rowers seeking GB selection and their coaches in each squad with 'their' Chief/Lead Coach after their section of the ergometer test is completed on Sat 24 October.
- Talented Athlete Scholarship Scheme (TASS). Nominations for the 2009/10 funding year will be based on previous results together with performances at this Assessment.

- Rowers requiring a Therapeutic Use Exemption Certificate (TUE) are reminded that they must have this with them at the Assessment. Please contact your squad doctor if you have any concerns.
