Hazards: 1. Two boats are on a collision course on a bend – the coxed four and the pair. 2. The pair is on the wrong side of the river. 3. The four's cox is not aware of the floating log ahead. 4. One of the rowers in the four doesn't have their gate done up. 5. Cox's lifejacket – crotch straps not fastened. 6. The four's cox doesn't have the kill-cord attached in the launch. 7. Trees on bend may be obstructing their view ahead. 8. The cox in the foreground isn't wearing a lifejacket – and is dressed in shorts and T-shirt during this winter scene. 9. The pair's coach in the launch is standing up and steering at the same time. 10. Four is turning around upstream of a bridge.
