Getting there

The British Rowing Offshore Development Day and the Offshore Championships are being held at Sandbanks Beach. The best entrance to the beach is located at Sandbanks Car Park, Banks Rd, Poole BH13 8QJ. Once you are on the beach you will need to turn to your left and walk 200m down the beach to find the event location.

If travelling by public transport the nearest bus stop is Banks Road.

From Poole:

- Breezer 60 to Sandbanks, bus stop Banks Road.

From Bournemouth:

- MI to Westover Road, CS to Poole, bus stop Banks Road
- Breezer 50 to Swanage, bus stop Banks Road.
- Village Line V2 to Bournemouth Pier, CS to Poole, bus stop Banks Road.

Trailer parking will be offsite at Carter Community School, Blandford Cl. Poole, BH15 4BQ.







Boat drop off and pick up

Boats can be dropped onto Sandbanks beach at the following times. Please note these are provisional and may change as access to the beach front from the carpark is narrow especially if the carpark is full.

Friday 19:00-21:00 Saturday 06:00-08:00 Sunday (for loading after racing) 18:00-21:00

Trailer drivers should notify Courtney (<u>courtney.macdonald@britishrowing.org</u>) by 5pm on Monday, 24 July with the day and time they expect to arrive at Sandbanks Beach to drop their boats off. At least 30 minutes before arrival, drivers are asked to contact Courtney on 078 7682 5202 to ensure they can be met and guided onto the beach front. If access to the beach is not possible after calling Courtney, trailer drivers will be directed to the Carter Community School to temporarily park their trailers. Courtney will keep contact with all trailer drivers with regards to when the boats can be dropped off. If access is possible you will meet Courtney at the entrance from the carpark to the beach as indicated on the map below.


Please be note that parking will not be reserved and will be limited in both car parks and on the main road, especially if the weather is nice.

Note: If you choose to park your car here, please print out the car parking pass in appendix 6 of this document. This must be visible at all times. Please see map below indicating the car park location. The school is not within walking distance to Sandbanks Beach, therefore carpooling is advised.







Competitor Services

Registration

Crews are expected to register at the registration desk between 09:00 and 09:30 on Saturday, 29 July to confirm their entry. This can be done by a crew representative.

Making Changes to Entries

Crew changes must be made to the Entries Secretary (<u>offshoreentries@britishrowing.org</u>) before the crew goes afloat, in accordance with the Rules of Racing, crews must use BROE2 to update substitutions prior to the Regatta; the system will be re-opened for a period to allow this. After this time, changes must be notified in person at the Registration Desk, with details of the substitute's registered club, name, date of birth and racing licence number as recorded by the relevant Great Britain rowing body.

Crews that scratch before the Regatta should scratch on BROE2 or inform the Entries Secretary directly by email. Crews scratching from an event at the Regatta must inform the Entries Secretary at the Registration Desk. Crews that have scratched cannot be reinstated.

Hire Boats

If you are using a hired boat please ensure you use the correct boat. James Andrews (james.andrews@britishrowing.org) will be available to help if you have any questions. After your race please ensure you get your boat back to it's parking space in a timely manner. The Filippi hire boats will be adjusted on a 159cm span. We would appreciate if you didn't change the span.

Hire boats can be bought of Filippi at the end of the event. The boats will be needed for the World Championships in Thonon so they can be reserved in Bournemouth but will be available in October.

Medals Ceremonies

The medal ceremonies will take place directly after the finals. If you have won a medal please assemble at the ceremonies located on the beach.

Changing Facilities, Showers and Toilets

Toilets are at the main beach entrance and there are portaloos near the start / finish line. There are no shower facilities, so it is suggested that competitors plan to use these facilities elsewhere. No bag drop facilities will be available at the venue.

Warming Up/Cooling Down

The course will include a beach start and finish, therefore there will no opportunity to warm up/cool down on the water.

Race Results

Results from the heats and finals will be posted as soon as possible after the races on the noticeboard.

Anti Doping

Spectating

Everyone is welcome to come and watch, but please be aware of boat movement on the beach and please do not swim in the race beach. Children aged 16 and under must be accompanied by an adult.

Food & Drink

We strongly recommend competitors bring their own food and drink along with this. However if you wish to purchase food and drink on site, there are cafes at the beach. (http://sandbanksbeachcafe.co.uk).

Medical

There will be qualified medical staff on site and they will deal with any medical situation. In the case of emergency follow instructions from venue security and the British Rowing staff.

Safety

Security

The boat park is located at the back of the beach above the high water mark and crews are advised not to leave any removable items in their boats overnight and to turn their boats over. Overnight security will be onsite from 6am - 6pm on Friday and Saturday night. However the Organising Committee and British Rowing cannot take any responsibility for damage to the boats. Please make sure you have adequate insurance.





Development Day

The Development Day is to support crews wishing to race the following day. The masterclass will allow crews to learn and practice how some of the fastest crews at the Mediterranean Games and Asian Beach Games have developed their techniques. This is also an opportunity for coxes to attend a briefing to learn how to plot a path around the course. This masterclass will be held on Saturday, 29 July starting at 10:00.

Information Point

There will be one information point onsite. This information point is located in the registration tent.

Volunteers

A great group of Champs Crew will be on site throughout the event. Please approach them if you have any questions. Please also remember that they are giving their time for free so that you may enjoy this event.

All junior competitors must be accompanied by a responsible adult while at the event. This responsible adult is responsible for the welfare, safety and appropriate supervision of competitor/s regardless of age, and is expected to know the whereabouts of their junior competitor/s at all times during the British Rowing Offshore Championships.

Notice of Regatta

Please ensure you have read and agree with the terms and conditions stated in the Notice of Regatta.

Weather

Protect yourself from the sunburns and skin damage. Wear suitable clothing, a hat and sunglasses that provide sun protection, make sure you regularly apply water-resistant sunscreen and if possible spend time in the shade when the sun's at its hottest. likewise please ensure you bring clothing for cooler weather.

Photography

There are official photographers and videographers at the regatta. These photographs and videos may be used on the website and social media sides of the regatta or by British Rowing. By entering the regatta, competitors and those responsible for them consent to this.

Competitors, and those responsible for them, should be aware that other, nonofficial photographers might operate at national sporting events and the subsequent photographs or





videos may be freely used in print, digital media or elsewhere, over which the Organising Committee and British Rowing has no control.

Appendix

Appendix 1. Rule of Racing

- 1. The Regatta is run in accordance with the Rules of British Rowing, the <u>British Rowing</u> <u>Rules of Racing</u>, the Offshore departures and <u>RowSafe</u> guidance together with its associated documents. Competitors and coaches are reminded that they should be familiar with these documents.
- 2. Entry fees will not be refunded if it should become necessary, for any reason, to abandon the Regatta or any event.
- 3. When it is not possible, for whatever reason, to complete the Championships or an event, the draw pattern may be changed or times from heats be used to determine which crews will progress to later rounds, or to determine the medal positions or the plaque winners.
- 4. Crews that fail to confirm their entry at Registration or pass Control Commission will not be permitted to start.
- 5. The Organising Committee reserves the right to exclude any crew or sculler from further competition in an event if it does not show sufficient competence. This is applied in the interests of safety and fairness to other competitors.
- 6. To win a medal, a crew must beat another crew, except for a gold medal in an event from which all other crews have withdrawn. Events with fewer than three entries at the close of entries may be timetabled within another Final.
- 7. All winners' identification shall be confirmed. Winners who cannot confirm their identity may not receive any crew or individual prize until their eligibility has been confirmed.
- 8. It is the competitor's responsibility to keep him/herself informed of any changes to the event programme.





Appendix 2. Racing Format and Conduct

- I. The aim of the progression system is to identify the fastest three crews in each event.
- 2. The start of the race will be a beach start with crews standing next to their floating boats. In line with the rules, and taking into account the weather conditions, each crew will be allowed two boat handlers at the discretion of the Race Director.
- 3. The heats will be raced over 4 km and finals raced over 6 km.
- 4. The boat handlers shall wear matching uniforms that is different in colour to their crew. The role of the boat handlers is to support the safe start and finish of their crew. The boat handlers shall at no time enter the boat or be in water deeper than shoulder height. The boat handlers are under the jurisdiction of the rules and race officials and their actions may result in their crew being penalised.
- 5. At the finish, crews shall approach the 'arrival zone' under full control and in a safe manner; crews are under obligation to avoid boats that are already in the arrival zone. Crews failing this, risk being disqualified.
- 6. The finish will be a running beach finish where one crew member will exit their boat and run across the finish line. The remaining members of the crew and boat handlers (see above) will promptly remove their boat from the arrival zone.



• When turning back onto the main track give way to oncoming traffic




All boats must sign in and out.

Traffic Pattern Beach FINISH






Finals 6 km course




