Introduction

With the World Rowing Coastal Championships and World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals taking place at Saundersfoot Beach, Wales in 2022 British Rowing (With Scottish Rowing and Welsh Rowing) is renewing its commitment to supporting and developing the growing coastal sculling community.

The quality of participation is only as strong as the quality of the coaches delivering activity. To strengthen activity around the England, British Rowing is looking to take on four new Coach Educators focused on delivering high-quality education focusing on the World Rowing Coastal Sculling format in England.

Purpose

To support the development coaches, rowers and event organisers through the delivery of high-quality World Rowing Coastal Sculling education and training.

Responsibilities

- Deliver British Rowing Coastal Sculling workshops.
- Abide by the Coach Education and Training Workforce Code of Conduct and British Rowing Policies and Guidance.
- Support the delivery of education and training to increase the number of coaches, rowers and event organisers.
- Provide British Rowing with course information.

Person Specification

Essential:

- Coaching, Teaching or Tutoring experience.
- Can model excellent coaching behaviours.
- Technically competent rowing coach qualified to UKCC Level 2 Club Coach or equivalent.
- Able to communicate effectively, inspire and enable.



- Knowledgeable in World Rowing Coastal Disciplines.
- Knowledge of operating on the sea in small craft
- Knowledgeable regarding marine conditions.
- Ability to write and complete a full written risk assessment.
- Ability to maintain databases of names rowers and relevant personal information in line with GDPR regulations.
- Current or willing to attend First Aid Training.
- Current or willing to attend Safeguarding and Protecting Children/Adults at Risk training.
- Current or will be expected to complete a DBS documentation as obtained through British Rowing.
- Completed or willing to complete British Rowing Risk assessment training.

Desirable:

- Experience of rowing or coaching at events that have been run under British Rowing or World Rowing Endurance or Beach Sprint format rules
- RYA L2 Powerboat (Coastal)
- Assessing or Quality Assurance experience

It would be desirable but not essential for the successful candidate to have at least one of the following forms of teaching qualifications:

- Teacher Training Qualification (Undergrad/Postgrad)
- PTLLS (Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector)
