ROWING COACH – Zero Hours

The Post

The Rowing Coach will be responsible to the Director of Rowing who, in turn, reports to the Director of Sport. The successful candidate will assist with coaching sessions with groups of junior rowers. A key part of the role is to energise and enthuse the rowers and teach them excellent fundamental rowing skills. Experience of rowing at all levels and/or coaching is essential.

Specific Responsibilities

- To assist the coaching of various age groups to a high standard.
- To show a commitment to safety.
- To undertake training and constructively take part in meetings to assist with the effective development of the post and post holder.
- To be committed to the school's core values and ethos and to demonstrate this commitment in the way duties are carried out.
- To maintain confidentiality and ensure that duties are undertaken with due regard to and compliance with the Data Protection and Equality Act at all times.
- To carry out duties and responsibilities in accordance with the school and Academy Trust's Health and Safety Policy and relevant Health and Safety legislation.
