GB Beach Sprint Teams

In 2024 the selection process for the GB Beach Sprint Teams will be divided into two streams.

Selection Opportunity 1;

Those senior rowers wishing to be considered for selection in the CMIx, CWIx or CMix2x, and those UI9 rowers wishing to be considered for selection in the UI9CMIx, UI9WIx or UI9Mix2x, must take part in **GB Beach Sprint Selection Trial I** in Bournemouth on 27 April. In addition all rowers must race at a minimum of one of the following events – Jersey Beach Sprint Regatta, English Beach Sprint Regatta, Welsh Senior Beach Sprint Championships, Scottish Beach Sprint Championships.

From the above events six senior athletes (3 female and 3 male) will be selected to compete at the European Beach Sprint Championships and World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals. At each of those events four of those rowers (2 female and 2 male) will be selected to race in the CMIx, CWIx and CMix2x. The two rowers from that group of six not selected to race at each of those events will act as reserves and boat handlers for the event, and will be given the opportunity to race in the Endurance categories at those competitions.

In addition, from the above events four U19 rowers (2 female and 2 male) will be selected and will form the U19CMIx, U19 CWIx and U19CMix2x to race at the European Beach Sprint Championships and World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals.

Selection Opportunity 2;

Those senior rowers and coxes wishing to be considered for selection in the CMix4x+, must take part in **GB Beach Sprint Selection Trial 2 - Senior**, on the weekend of 3-4 August. From that trial four senior athletes (2 female and 2 male) and one cox will be selected to race the CMix4x+ at the World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals. In addition, those senior Para rowers wishing to be considered for selection in the PR3CMix2x must take part in **GB Beach Sprint Selection Trial 2 - Senior**, on the weekend of 3-4 August.

Selection Process Summary Those U19 rowers wishing to be considered for selection are required to race at the **Welsh Junior Beach Sprint Championships**, and attend **GB Beach Sprint Selection Trial 2 – U19** on 3-4 August. From that trial six U19 athletes (3 female and 3 male) will be selected to compete at the World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals. Four of those U19 rowers (2 female and 2 male) will be selected to race in the U19 CM2x and U19 CW2x, with the remaining two rowers (1 female and 1 male) selected as reserves/boat handlers for the World Finals. These six rowers will also be offered the opportunity to race at the Coupe de la Jeunesse Beach Sprints.

GB Coastal Endurance Teams

GB will also nominate crews to compete at the European and World Coastal Rowing Championships in the Endurance categories. Rowers who demonstrate they have future potential within the Beach Sprint format may be nominated to race as Great Britian in either the National Federation endurance events at the European Coastal Rowing Championships and/or race as Great Britan in one or more of the boat classes at the World Costal Rowing Championships. This opportunity will be targeted in particular at individuals who are not already selected in one of the GB Beach Sprint crews, but who demonstrates future potential in the Beach Sprint format, which may be enhanced through the experience of competing in Endurance Coastal Sculling events. Opportunities may also be provided to Beach Sprint team members, including reserves, where it is felt using the endurance events to provide additional coastal racing experience would be beneficial.
