



British Rowing Club Championships 2026

Victor Ludorum Rules

1. Separate Victor Ludorum plaques will be awarded to the clubs winning the most points (as set out below) across the Junior and Senior events.
2. The club with the most points overall (across Junior and Senior events) will win a £11,000 SL Racing Single Scull supplied by Cymba Racing. British Rowing will pass the winners details to Cymba Racing who will coordinate all aspects of the manufacture and delivery of the prize.
3. Points will be awarded as follows for placings in A Finals in all Junior (including Adaptive) and Senior Championship (including Adaptive) events provided the crew has beaten at least one other crew (i.e. in straight finals, the last crew is not awarded any points):

4. The winning crew or sculler in Senior Club and Beginner events will be awarded points as follows, provided at least two crews start:

Boat class	1st
8+	16
4x/4+	12
2x	8
1x	4

5. Points for composite crews will be awarded pro rata to the number of rowing individuals in each crew at the time of the draw. For example in a Championship 4- event with three entries a winning X/Y composite with three rowers from club X and one from club Y will win 18 points for club X and 6 for club Y.
6. A provisional result will be announced at the end of each day's racing.



7. If racing has to be cancelled the Victor Ludorum prize will only be awarded if, at the point of cancellation, the result is beyond doubt (i.e. the leading club is so far ahead it can't be caught).
8. Should there be a tie for first place, the number of gold medals achieved would be used to determine the winner.
9. In the event of any dispute the decision of the Organising Committee is final.
